Dagger called "left hand" Toledo, Spain, 1855 Wrought iron and steel

Length: 55 cm; Blade length: 43 cm

Total length: 59 cm

Single-edged steel blade, guilloched back, counter-edge, ending in a point, two-thirds of the blade decorated with acid-etched foliage and avian figures. The heel of the blade is rectangular with a thumb rest and circular openings.

On both sides, two birds of prey carrying banners bearing the words 'Arta Fa de Toledo' and 'Ano de 1855'.

Iron frame, triangular hilt centred on military trophies and attributes, straight quillons, filigree four-ribbed spindle, pommel with knob.
