



Large Empire Period Chiseled Gilt Bronze Mantel Clock, 19th Century



Description

Large Empire period mantel clock - Restoration dating from the beginning of the 19th century (circa 1800-1810) in chased gilt bronze with exceptional gilding quality.

An antique-style character is seated above the dial and holds a scroll in his left hand and a very finely chased lyre in his right hand. The details of the drapery, face and sandals are carefully worked, alternating between matt and shiny gilt bronze. His attributes suggest that he is probably Apollo, god of the arts and patron of the muses who also embodies youth, beauty and harmony. Indeed, references to Antiquity are part of the imperial language under the reign of Napoleon I who uses them as symbols of power.

It displays Roman numerals and rests on a large rectangular base with a decorative relief in protrusion. It depicts trumpets, laurels and a crown, also contributing to the military and royal symbolism characteristic of the Empire style.
