Magnificent oil on canvas measuring 60cm x 48.5cm plus period frame, a little chipped in places (which I point out so as not to be blamed) 85cm x 72cm Lively alley in North Africa signed lower left J.NORO Jean-Baptiste Noro, sometimes Jean Noro, is a French painter and anarchist born September 11, 1841 in Montmerle-sur-Saône (Ain) and died in June 1909 in Tunis (Tunisia). A former student of Gustave Courbet, he joined the National Guard in which he was appointed officer. Already involved in the International Workers' Association (AIT), he participated in the Paris Commune and commanded the 22nd battalion, responsible for defending the Vanves fort. He was sentenced in absentia to deportation in 1872. Exiled in Geneva, he participated in

the anti-authoritarian split in the International. He is married to Émilie Noro, who will testify from the Versailles prisons, but he has a relationship in exile with Paule Minck. The Noro couple returned to Paris after the amnesty of 1881, before settling in the colonies of North Africa.
