Frédéric Soulacroix was born on June 14, 1858, in Bordeaux, France. From an early age, he showed a keen interest in art and was encouraged by his family to pursue his artistic talents. He began his studies at the École des Beaux-Arts in Bordeaux, where he developed his skills in painting and sculpture.
