The model of the sculpture is kept at the Louvre Museum.

It is the work of Denis FOYATIER.

This subject is characteristic of the liberal boom that would lead to the revolution of 1830 and the advent of the monarchy of King Louis Philippe. Working condition, complete with its bell and pendulum.

The marble is cracked on the back below the movement.
