Description

Superb Louis XVI style inkwell by the great goldsmith Risler et Carré.

The inkwell rests on a large quadruped base in gilded metal and mirror, encircled by a vermeil mount with a torus of laurel leaves and a gallery superbly openworked with flower motifs.

The body of the inkwell is in porcelain painted with a pastoral scene with two goats and a ruin. It rests on a small vermeil pedestal decorated with a laurel leaf frieze. The lid, painted with a pair of birds and two butterflies, is fixed by a hinged mount also in vermeil. The grip is formed by a fruiting branch.

The small original glass cup is present. It is

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supported by a structure, still in vermeil,
openworked with flower motifs recalling the base
gallery.

The inkwell (gallery, pedestal and lid) is
hallmarked:

. Goldsmith's hallmark: RC for Risler and Carré,
active from 1897 to 1912

The bottom of the inkwell, in silver-plated metal
and hallmarked:

. Square goldsmith's hallmark: RC

. In full: A. Risler & Carré // Paris

A superb, very elegant piece in pure Louis XVI
style, made by very great goldsmiths at the turn
of the 19th century.

Its large dimensions make it a superb desk item,
very precious and decorative.
