Allan was born in Alloa, on the Firth of Forth, and attended the Foulis Academy in Glasgow for seven years. In 1767 he moved to Rome, where he lived for ten years; this was the most successful period of his life. In Rome, Allen painted ambitious historical paintings, portraits, caricatures and genre scenes. Returning to London in 1777, he spent two years trying to establish himself. Failing and ill, he
