Dedicated to the Duchess of Gramont, from the Cabinet of the Duke of Praslin,

Isidor Stanislas Helman (1743 Lille- 1809 Paris), pupil of Jean Philippe Le Bas, was a renowned engraver at the time, and his works were sought after by numerous amateurs, especially "gracious" subjects such as this one.
