Description

Dutch School of the 17th century, Scarlet Macaw Parrot and Grey Parakeet, perched on a red copper milk cane in an undergrowth. At the bottom of a breakthrough, a landscape with a village. Oil on canvas, the painting is presented in a very beautiful Louis XVI period piastre frame in carved oak and gilded with gold leaf. Attributed to Matthias Withoos or his workshop. Matthias Withoos, also known as Calzetta Bianca or Calzetti, born in Amersfoort (United Provinces) in 1627 and died in Hoorn in 1703, is a painter of the Dutch Golden Age. Author, among other things, of still life and panoramas, his style, close to that of Otto Marseus van Schrieck, is recognizable by the detail of insects, reptiles and undergrowth in the foreground of his paintings (Wikipedia).
