Delivered without frame. Arches paper, numbered 53/75 and signed. This original lithograph was printed in 12 colors on the presses of the master printer Ballon in Paris. 75 proofs on Arches numbered from 1 to 75 and 70 proofs on Hollande Van Gelder numbered from 1 to 70. Edition Romanet Paris. Sheet dimensions: 75 x 54 cm. Subject dimensions: 46 x 46 cm. Claude Venard (1913-1999, Paris) Claude Venard, painter of the School of Paris, friend of Braque, Picasso and Giacometti, was described as a cubist painter. Claude Venard remained faithful, in fact, for most of his life to an instinctive post-cubism. From his first exhibition at the Salon d'Automne and the Tuileries in Paris in 1937, and at the Salon des
