Its top and the center are decorated with Louis XVI ribbon knot. Design inspired by the wall - lights delivered by Claude Galle to the Petit Trianon in 1809 . The wall - lights are signed Vian and bear the inventory numbers on the back. We offer the electrification with European or American standards. France.
