Description

Anton Büschelberger (1869 Eger - 1934
Dresden), Pointer, around 1930, made by the Karl
Ens porcelain manufactory in Volkstedt
(Thuringia), model number 2478, 6. Porcelain
with underglaze decoration and terrain plinth. 17
cm (height) x 37 cm (length) x 11 cm (depth).
Signed "A. Büschelberger" on the plinth, marked
under the base and with the model number.
- Plinth and right hind leg with cracks, probably
caused by firing, base and underside of the flanks

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- The elegance of the hunting dog -

with glaze damage.

With his head slightly bent forward and his tail

stretched out, the hound is on the prowl with his front leg slightly raised. He has followed the scent and already has his prey in sight. Anton Büschelberger captures the moment just before the drama of the hunt unfolds, showing the dog in a state of intense, instinctive tension. Every muscle seems to be visible under the fur, giving the animal a special elegance. The coloration, which matches the true-to-life effect of its appearance, was created using an early airbrush technique that produces delicate color gradients that match the shimmer of the porcelain.
