The cassolette rests on a triangular base supported by three small round feet, the body is flanked by three eagle-shaped uprights, the shaft very elegantly twisted. The eagles are joined by a circle decorated with scrapers. The handle in the shape of a pine cone. A work characteristic of the end of the 18th century Imbued with antiquity both in form and decoration, our pair of cassolettes, including a similar model of six-light candelabra delivered in 1787 by the merchant-mercier Dominique DAGUERRE for the Salon des Nobles de la
