Passionate about drawing and painting since his childhood, he came to France, around his twentieth year, and settled in Paris, an artistic center for all young talents. He was a student of Tony Robert-Fleury and Bouguereau, recognized masters and school leaders for a large number of "official" painters of the 19th century. At the
