Provenance: Tchen Gi-Vane Collection Tchen Gi-Vane was born in 1924, the daughter of a father who was a great newspaper publisher in the Republic of China, Cheng Shewo. A graduate of the Shanghai Higher School of Music, she went on tour in France with a Hong Kong music group and met her husband, the French engineer Philippe Bertrand (1926-2023). They got married and settled permanently in Rambouillet, surrounded by the young woman's works of art
