Rectangular 5-blade Sanza This rectangular sanza has five metal blades, or lamellae, that produce sounds when plucked. The instrument is engraved with ancestral geometric and circular patterns evoking the spots of a feline, symbols of power and prestige. Hardwood, wrought iron, brass wire. Old honey and brown patina, with signs of use. Good general condition, see photos. Chokwe, Democratic Republic of Congo, Angola, 19th century. Dimensions: 14.1 x 7.4 cm.
