

Eagle Of The National Guard Flag Model 1852 - 2nd Republic Presidency Of Louis Napoleon

Description

Flag eagle of the National Guard of the province of the Presidency - Louis Napoleon period, in chiseled silver-plated bronze. Eagle head turned to the right, resting on a box with the number L.N, after "M.A. Marion". Height with its socket: 27cm, on a plexiglass base. Imperial eagle of the first model in silver-plated bronze. It represents the uncrowned imperial eagle with outstretched wings holding in its talons the sparkling spindle of Jupiter, placed on a base, the head turned to the right. It is assembled in several parts. Cast copper box bearing the initials "L. N." The fine upper molding between the box and the spindle of Jupiter without a founder's mark was probably replaced in view of the various threaded holes under the spindle. Silver-plated bronze socket, missing the ring intended to hang the tie. The
