animals, structures, jugglers, trees and flowers... Camille Le Tallec's workshop operated independently from 1930 to 1990 when it was taken over by the American jeweler Tiffany & Co. Le Tallec extended its fame to the most prestigious tables, including commissions for Queen Elizabeth II of England, Kings Mohammed V and Hassan II of Morocco, Queen Juliana of Holland, Prince Abdelaziz bin Ahmed Al Thani of Qatar, Shah Mohammad Reza Pahlavi of Iran, the French Republic, the City of Paris, and a few wealthy individuals or artists. In the late 2000s, the Le Tallec workshop suffered the consequences of the global financial crisis and saw its business, which was closely tied to the American market due to its ties with Tiffany, decline.
