Golden bamboo style handle, spout with animal head spout, the round lid decorated with coral and a golden fretel in the shape of a winged griffin, Dimensions: Height: 22 cm, Width: 20 cm, Weight: 900gr Good general condition with some signs of wear to the gilding. An interior spike on the lid is missing (photo) This type of piece illustrates a decorative arsenal from the inter-style years, inspired by the Orient. Manufacture of Bayeux or Gosse, (his Parisian associate) around 1850/. no signature.
