Ernest Lawson, an American impressionist painter, was a prominent member of the group of "Eight", an association of artists committed to opposing the academicism imposed by the National Academy of Design. This collective distinguished itself by its desire to promote a freer and more contemporary artistic vision. Mainly known for his landscapes, Lawson draws his inspiration from Alfred Sisley, master of impressionism, as well as from the American John Henry Twachtman. His style is
