Very good condition, the painting has been restored and relined. **BIOGRAPHY:** Denis DECRÈS, born June 18, 1761 in Chaumont (Haute-Marne) and died December 7, 1820 in Paris, is a naval officer and politician of the Consulate and the First Empire. Maritime prefect in Lorient, he became Minister of the Navy from 1801 to 1814, vice-admiral, senator, grand officer and head of the 10th cohort of the Legion of Honor in 1804, inspector general of the
