Pair of solid lemon wood chairs, enhanced with polychrome paintings decorated with garlands of flowers and an antique vase also containing a bouquet of flowers on the backs.

Quite rare in France, these chairs are in the style of George Hepplewhite's furniture (1727-1786)*, our chairs bear a stenciled mark underneath: René Gérard 17 rue Bleue, probably Parisian address. The wood is very beautiful, with a very warm tint.

Good condition, no play.

*Georges Heppelwhite spread the style of Robert
Adam who worked mainly for the aristocracy.
He popularized the chair with a back cut into a
shield where three feathers often appear, the
emblem of the Prince of Wales.
