



Porcelain Painting Representing The Work Madame Vigée Le Brun And Her Daughter, 19th Century



Description

This porcelain painting in the style of KPM dates from the 19th century, it represents the famous painting Madame Vigée Le Brun and her daughter made by the French painter Élisabeth Vigée Le Brun in 1789.

This self-portrait was painted for Charles Claude Flahaut de La Billarderie, Count of Angiviller, director of the king's buildings. Seized during the French Revolution, the work is now kept at the Louvre Museum in Paris.

The very affectionate embrace between the mother and her daughter is perfectly faithful to the original work and from a technical point of view, the colors, shadows and the finesse of the line are remarkable.
