Late 19th century France - Haute-Loire This small wooden folder, finely carved and engraved with the name "Rosalie", seems to have come straight out of a 19th century lacemaker's workshop. Dated 1884, even if it may seem late to some, it bears the imprint of a time when every object, even the most humble, was loaded with meaning and history. One can almost imagine a young Rosalie, sitting by a window bathed in light, concentrating on her work, carefully intertwining the threads to create delicate lace. This folder, engraved with her name, was perhaps a gift from a loved one: a carpenter father, an affectionate brother or an attentive lover, eager to show her their pride and affection. The engraved patterns, both sober and elegant, tell a story of love for a job well done, where folk art combined

These everyday objects became personal treasures, imbued with memory and know-how, witnesses of a time when humans and craftsmanship came together to create such masterpieces.
