Description

Jacques Adnet's famous rolling bar "Grand bar", Art Deco circa 1930, referenced under model number 131 in the catalog of the Compagnie des Arts Français. Jacques Adnet (1900-1984) was a French architect and designer who began his career in one of the first modern art workshops, La Maîtrise, directed by Maurice Dufrêne. In 1928, Jacques Adnet became the director of the Compagnie des Arts Français and collaborated with many artists such as Picasso, Dunand and Perriand. Thanks to his works featuring clean, simple designs and the use of
