Louis-Ernest Barrias at the Beaux-Arts in Paris, he exhibited his work at the Salon des artistes français from 1881. Rewarded, he became a member of the society of this salon in 1888. His last salon was in 1905. Laporte produced a large number of plaster works published, among others, by the founder Siot-Decauville. He made his debut at the Salon des Artistes Français. His Bust of Parrache for the Hotel de Ville in Lyon is mentioned.

He received an honorable mention in 1883, a third medal in 1885, a travel grant in 1886, a second medal in 1897 and a silver medal in 1900 at the Universal Exhibition.
