Solid silver coffee pot, 18th century, London 1777 - John Carter II Elegant coffee pot in solid silver 925 thousandths, made in 1777 by the famous London goldsmith John Carter II. In pure English neoclassical style, this piece is distinguished by its refinement and the harmony of its proportions. Its curved body rests on a pedestal decorated with an engraved frieze, while finely chiseled raised garlands adorn the contours of the piece. The richly decorated spout has a fluid silhouette embellished with pearl motifs and sculpted volutes. The ebony handle, mounted on silver fasteners, contrasts elegantly with the shine of the metal and ensures a comfortable grip. The hinged lid is topped with a superb knob in the shape of a sculpted pineapple, a symbol of luxury and hospitality, a characteristic detail of 18th

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century English goldsmithing.
