Josef Ullmann (13 June 1870 Nekmír - 1922

Prague-Královské Vinohrady) was a Czech landscape painter, a student of Julius Marák at the Academy of Painting in Prague. From 1900, Ullmann's paintings were regularly reproduced in Zlatá Praze and other journals. From 1902, his paintings began to appear regularly in exhibitions organized by Krasoumná jednota, Umelecká beseda and Jednota výtvarných umelcu. In 1905 he was selected as one of the artists representing Czech fine arts at the 9th International Exhibition

in Munich. In the spring of 1906 he exhibited a large collection of 15 paintings for the first time at the Annual Exhibition of the Krasoumná jednota. In 1908 he held a large group exhibition at the Topic Salon and then in Pardubice. Since 1900 Ullmann's paintings have been regularly reproduced in Zlatá Praze and other magazines. From 1902 his paintings began to appear regularly in exhibitions organized by the Krasoumná jednota, the Umelecká beseda and the Jednota výtvarných umelcu. In 1905 he was selected as one of the artists representing Czech fine arts at the 9th International Exhibition in Munich. In the spring of 1906, he exhibited for the first time a large collection of 15 paintings at the annual exhibition of the Beautiful Unity. In 1908, he organized a large group exhibition at the Topic Salon, then in Pardubice. From 1905 to 1922, he was a member of the Mánes Association of Fine Arts, with which he exhibited regularly.
