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This work depicts an iconic view of the Grand Canal in Venice, dominated by the sumptuous Palazzo Balbi.

The elegant gondolas, the sparkling reflections on the water and the meticulous architectural details immerse the viewer in the excitement of 18th-century Venice.

The artist manages to capture a soft light that highlights the Baroque façades and accentuates the dreamlike atmosphere of the Serenissima.

Stylistic and symbolic analysis

The painting illustrates the precise and refined style of Apollonio Domenichini, often identified as the Master of the Langmatt Foundation Views. Inspired by Canaletto, Domenichini is distinguished by a meticulous treatment of perspectives and plays of light, giving a poetic dimension to his representations of Venice.

The work also reflects the symbolic importance of the city.

The Grand Canal, Venice's main artery, is presented here as a place of life and exchange, while the Palazzo Balbi evokes the splendor and power of the Venetian nobility.

This type of view met the demand of wealthy European art lovers who wanted to immortalize their memories of the Grand Tour.

### Biography of the artist

Apollonio Domenichini, nicknamed il Meneghetti, is a Venetian painter active in the 18th century.

His name is mainly associated with the art historian Rodolfo Pallucchini, who identified him as the Master of the Langmatt Foundation Views thanks to his extensive research on Venetian vedutisti.

Pallucchini, in his work
La Pittura Veneziana del Settecento (1950),
attributed several views of Venice to
Domenichini, highlighting his talent for capturing
urban scenes with precision and sensitivity.
