- Pocket or pocket watch in solid silver, chiseled and guilloché, bowl decorated with foliage, stems and flowers with a shield with the initials LA engraved in hollow. - French swan title hallmark 800/1000 for the importation of watch cases from abroad in use in France from 1893 to 1970 present on the edge of the pocket watch case with the mark of the precious metals office of Montbéliard in Doubs (25) and on the front of the head of the pendant, bowl, dust cover partially erased. - Number 25993...4 engraved in hollow and present on the bowl and the dust cover. - Smooth edge of the watch and perimeter of the bezel and edge of the bowl plated with pink gold partially erased and bowl chiseled and guilloché.

- Crown winder in brass and beveled mineral glass. - Sky blue and white enamel dial with

cartouche, Roman numeral painted in red on the cartouches for the hours and gold surround of the cartouches. - Gold-colored index graduation for the minutes, Louis XV hands in gold metal for the hours and minutes. - Small seconds dial at six o'clock with railway graduation, gold metal second hand. - Chiseled and guilloché dust cover marked in hollow with the mention cylinder 10 rubies. - Movement signed in hollow in an oval Labor Bté and the letter A in capitals engraved in hollow on the movement for a movement intended to be inserted in a solid silver pocket watch case. - Movement in gilded brass set with 10 jewels with cylinder escapement, screws, crown, crown wheel, advance and delay racket in polished steel and located above the balance wheel. - Pendant winder and time setting by pressing the small push button located to the left of the pendant head while turning the winder crown clockwise at the same time. - In perfect working order, revised by a watchmaker. - Period end of the 19th century around 1885-1900.
