Hartwell YEARGANS (1915-2005) Original etching Signed and dated 1974 "Jazz musicians" Very good condition numbered out of 50 copies Dimensions of the subject 25 X 18 cm Dimensions of the sheet 32 X 25 cmBIOGRAPHY: Painter and engraver born in Kansas City, Hartwell YEARGANS moved to New York in 1936 to join his older brother James Conroy Yeargans, who worked on the murals of the WPA hospital in Harlem, and who would later be a member of the Spiral Group. James introduced his younger brother to many leading African-American artists of the Harlem Renaissance and to younger artists such as Jacob Lawrence, Romare Bearden, Roy DeCarava, Robert Blackburn and Norman Lewis. After his military service, the young Yeargans studied
