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The bridal vase was part of the ritual of wedding gifts offered by a close family member, a tradition deeply rooted in France during the years 1850 to 1930. It symbolizes the promise of deep love and eternal happiness for the couple. These vases were part of a set: two large vases for the bride and groom and two smaller ones for the best man and the bridesmaid.
