James introduced his younger brother to many of the leading African-American artists of the Harlem Renaissance and to younger artists such as Jacob Lawrence, Romare Bearden, Roy DeCarava, Robert Blackburn, and Norman Lewis. 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Yeargans studied painting at the Art Students
League with Morris Kantor, and anatomy with
Richard Hale. He held his first solo exhibition at
the Matrix Gallery in 1955, while also heading
the visual committee of the Lower Eastside
Neighborhood Association and exhibiting at the
Village Art Center. In the mid-1960s, Hartwell
Yeargans took up printmaking, exhibiting for the
first time at the Associated American Arts
Gallery in New York.
