Francis ROBINET (20th century) "Paquebot FRANCE at the Penhoët shipyards" Oil on panel signed lower right Dim. 59.5 X 80 cm without frame Good condition The France liner is a transatlantic liner built at the Chantiers de l'Atlantique, in Saint-Nazaire, where it was launched on May 11, 1960 in the presence of the President of the French Republic, General de Gaulle. At 314 meters long, it was the longest liner (passenger ship) ever built in the world throughout its period of activity until the launch in 2004 of the Queen Mary 2, 345 m (1,132 ft) long. It thus remained the largest liner in the world for 42 years, a record that still stands today. Its home port is Le Havre and it was put into service in January 1962, on behalf of the Compagnie générale transatlantique (CGT). For
