Antique gilded wooden monkey sculpture, eyes made of mica. Burma or Thailand, early 20th century. In Burmese culture, a seated monkey can symbolize obedience or contemplation. It is sometimes seen as a guardian or disciple, reflecting the qualities of vigilance and devotion. In Thailand, it is often associated with the stories of the Ramayana, in particular with Hanuman, the monkey king, who symbolizes strength, courage and loyalty. In both cultures, this sculpture could be associated with patience and reflection, a form of representation of human nature inviting meditation and self-understanding.
