The Passover celebration commemorates God's liberation of the Jewish people from slavery in ancient Egypt, and their subsequent freedom as a people, under the leadership of Moses. Passover is a spring festival that begins on the 15th of the Hebrew month of Nissan and lasts for seven days (or eight days in
