with jewel-like enamel accents further enhancing the luxurious design. The relief-applied gold adds texture and depth to this exquisite decorative plate. The reverse bears the blue beehive mark, traditionally associated with Royal Vienna porcelain. The Imperial and Royal Porcelain Manufactory of Vienna, commonly known as Royal Vienna, was founded in 1718 and became one of Europe's most prestigious porcelain manufacturers, supplying luxurious hand-painted pieces to European aristocracy. Though the factory ceased operations in 1864, its distinctive style continued to influence later porcelain workshops.
