Millar was introduced in painting in the USA, but he studied under two famous painters in Paris: Henri Martin and the excellent portrait painter Giovanni Boldini. From Paris he regularly visited Algiers, he made its bazaar his favourite subject. He returned to the US aged almost 40. Millar and his wife were killed by a train in 1913 while crossing the railway tracks.
