The story of our laughing Buddha dates back to the 10th century after Jesus Christ (15 centuries after Buddha), in China, where he led a quiet monastic life he was attracted to good food. Of a jovial nature, he was noted for his great generosity and humble kindness. Over the centuries, Budai was incorporated into the Buddhist tradition, becoming at the same time the divinity of happiness and abundance. Budai (in
