Jean Hourrègue (1919-1983) was a French figurative landscape painter from Pontacq in Béarn. The son of a typographer, he studied at the École d'Arts de Tarbes and then at the École des Beaux-Arts de Toulouse before moving to Paris to pursue his artistic career. Hourrègue is known for his nostalgic and gentle Pyrenean landscapes, capturing the region's natural beauty with a particular sensitivity. His figurative style and mastery of watercolor contributed to his reputation in art circles. Unfortunately, his career was abruptly cut short by a car accident in 1983, when he was 58 years old. Despite this, his works continue to be appreciated and sought after by collectors and art lovers. His paintings are regularly auctioned, reflecting the ongoing interest in his work.
