Description

This gilt bronze table clock dating from the early 1800s is a charming French Empire clock depicting allegory of the arts. Arched case, flanked by two putti, one seated with a book and the other upright, one foot resting on books, intent on playing a musical instrument; the clock's base, with two rectangular steps and decorative frieze with floral motifs, in the Empire style, adds an additional touch of elegance, while the beaded-bordered hemispherical feet provide good stability. The white enamel dial with Roman numerals within mock bookcase surmounted by laurel wreaths and plant festoons, although it has a small felure, is framed by a fine leaf motif. The mask above the dial is an Empire-style decorative element that enriches the clock's design. This finely chiseled gilt bronze library clock is ideal
