Dimensions: Frame: 56.7 x 82 cm On view: 43 x 57.2 cm In ancient Rome, the tepidarium (from the Latin tepidus, "lukewarm") was the part of the thermal baths where the Romans took lukewarm steam baths. In the organization of the ancient bath, the tepidarium is the intermediary between the caldarium and the frigidarium; it thus constitutes the necessary airlock between the hot zones and
