Description

Antique frame, wood and stucco, gilded (wear from use). Frame dimensions: 71 x 60 cm. Painting dimensions: 59 x 49 cm. Signed lower right. Located on the back. Impasse Schuddeveld, Brussels center. Accessible between nos. 21 and 23 of the Petite rue des Bouchers, this narrow cobbled alley leads to two basket-handle passages. The one on the left, dating from the 17th century, leads to the Toone VII puppet theater and museum, established here in 1966. The cul-de-sac is spanned by more recent double brick brace arches. On the northeast side rise sober two-story buildings (nos. 1, 2), whose 19th-century appearance hides an old core, revealed at no. 2 by hook anchors. Raphaël LAGYE (Antwerp, 1862-1952).
