

To make himself known, he exhibited his pieces at the Saint-Ouen flea market. In November 1961, a decorator from Bobois noticed his works at the flea market and offered to include his lamps in the Bobois catalog. This collaboration lasted until 1973. From 1961 to 1973, he also participated in trade fairs where he exhibited his creations and lighting In 1973, he left for Cannes where he set up another studio. Since 1973, he has continued to produce lamps, sculptures and other decorative objects with his son Benjamin at his side. His
