wood engraving Gabriel Belot will receive many orders for illustrations, but his very deep wish will be to learn to paint As soon as he had the opportunity he bought himself some colors and received advice from the painters of Montmartre. A great career would open up to him where he would teach in Paris until around the 1930s, where he would leave everything to come and settle in Provence, more precisely in Méounes les Montrieux. Also passionate about nature, he would leave from morning to night in all weathers, in the countryside in order to restore on his canvas the marvelous colors of the countryside and the undergrowth.
