He is known for his representations of naked women, between hypnotized gazes and mysterious gestures, in unusual places, such as train stations or classical buildings, sometimes accompanied by skeletons, men in bowler hats or scientists straight out of a Jules Verne story. Visible at the Galerie Courcelles Antiquités, at 41 rue des Acacias, in the 17th arrondissement of Paris
