Height: 17.4 cm. TOULOUSE, 18th century. Rare in provenance and size, in perfect condition. Let us recall in passing that these pitchers were the wine measures of the Ancien Régime. This elegant shape with the characteristic lid of Toulouse production is clearly of medieval inspiration.
