The lamp is placed on a wooden base frequently used under vases, which accentuates its Asian character. Made of beautiful, very white porcelain with generous enamel, this lamp has no defects. The bronze base discreetly encircles the base of the porcelain body. The oil burner, also in bronze and brass, is finely chiseled. A bronze collar decorated with small flowers of all shapes with very varied petals supports the glass guide, in brass, adorned with a vine branch. The glass itself is inserted into a magnificent crystal globe also engraved with a bunch of grapevines and leaves. This globe brings a lot of softness to the lighting.
