The service features finely moulded powder blue borders created using a resist decoration technique, allowing crisp white bird and grapevine motifs to emerge against the vibrant blue ground. Each piece is hand-painted with beautifully detailed rose vines, combining bold cobalt, soft pinks, and lush green tones. Gilded highlights enhance the forms and
