



Christ In Ivory, France 17th Century.



## Description

Large Christ measuring 37 centimeters from the end of the hands to the end of the feet and 23.5 centimeters wide. A true work with a system attributed to or in the taste of Pierre Simon Jaillot, Christ, sculpted with his mouth open, has, by the mechanism of a removable peg, a system which brings back the dentition. We can therefore admire Christ with or without teeth. What did the artist want to contextualize by adding this detail to his work? Sculptor of art objects born in Saint Claude in the Jura. In addition to the refinement brought to the execution of this sculpture in the precision of the chiseling at the level of the hair and the beard, the drapery and the protruding cord!! This sculpture presents a curiosity! Christ is represented with his mouth open, a removable peg brings back the teeth ??Cross brought back
